This statuettes collection represents the Güegüense, a satirical street drama accompanied by music and dance, developed in the eighteenth century. The beautifully costumed and masked protagonist, El Güegüe, cleverly uses verbal artistry in Spanish, Basque and Nahuatl, an Amerindian language, to demonstrate subservience to the colonial authorities while ridiculing them. It was declared by the UNESCO, in November 2005, as an Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity. Born in March 4, 1953, Harold González, author of these statuettes, is a musician and sculptor.

The gourd is the fruit of a wild tree that grows naturally in the plains of Nicaragua. The flesh of its fruit is used for livestock feed and the dryed and ground seeds for a beverage. The bark of the gourd fruit has varied uses, from glasses for soft drinks crates and gourds to take and store water. In RIVAS grandmothers from this town transform this nut into real watermarks that evoke nature, flowers, fruits and birds.
